강원대학교 인문과학 연구소 HK 인문치료 사업단은 2011년 7월 7일 '인문치료에서의 소통의 방법론'이라는 주제 하에 제 3차 국제 학술대회를 개최하게 되었습니다. 2회에 걸친 지난 학술대회는 현대 사회에서의 인문학과 치료의 관계, 그리고 마음의 치유가 궁극적으로 지향하는 행복이란 무엇인가라는 주제를 통해 인문치료의 치료적 이상을 모색하는 자리였습니다. 이번 제 3차 인문치료 국제 학술대회를 통해 강원대학교 인문치료 사업단은 이제 본격적으로 인문치료의 구체적 치료 방법론을 어떻게 정립할 것인가 하는 문제를 던져보고자 합니다.

무엇보다 인문치료가 제기하는 소통의 방법론은 소통의 매뉴얼도 아니고 소통의 기술론도 아닙니다. 또한 쌍방 간의 이익의 점점이나 논리의 점점을 찾아가는 소통이 아닙니다. 혹은 한편의 논리나 주장의 정당성과 합리성을 확인하는 작업도 아닙니다. '어떻게 한 인간을 온전히 이해하고 그 고통에 공감하며 그 고통으로부터 행복의 길을 예비할 것인가의 질문으로서' 인문치료는 소통이라는 개념을 제안하고 있습니다. 그래서 인문치료에서의 소통의 개념은 어렵고 힘든 작업이자 동시에 그 의미의 중요성이 새삼 되새김되어지는 개념이라 생각합니다. 저는 여러 귀빈들을 모시고 이루어지는 제3차 국제 학술대회가 이 소통이라는 개념을 중심으로 의미 있고 활기찬 대회가 되기를 진심으로 기원합니다.
